### Why create a new Foundation?

- To encourage research through making financing available
- To meet a perceveid and obvious demand by the Scientific Community
- dedicated just and only to the fields of ALS and motor neurons
- whose purpose is to finance the « best » of research projects and teams
- across Europe, without national barriers
- encouraging cross-fertilisation, networking and exchanges
- To accelerate pharmaceutical and therapeutical translations of key findings in patients best interests




### How does it work? (1)

- non-profit organization
- under the aegis of Fondation de France and corresponding philantropic bodies in Europe (Fondation Roi Baudouin, ...)
- funding secured for 10 years
  - following a strict set of governance rules
  - securing perrenity (not a « one-shot », « one-year » initiative)
  - transparent and certified accounts
  - keeping administrative expenses to an absolute minimum making sure that donations are directed towards research only

# What have we achieved so far in terms of fund raising?

- Donors are originating from the business and finance community and have had long-time relationship with Founder Thierry Latran
- A Foundation set up by entrepreneurs for their friend "geared towards efficiency and results"
- Funds raised (June 2008-November 2009): € 2.4 m
- Commitments 10 years: € 7m
- A small but trustful "core" donors base: 120
   from across Europe (France, Belgium, UK, Switzerland,...)

years


• Pilot Grants: circa € 100,000 per year over two (2) years

First Call for projects

Our goal: Receiving projects from all over Europe + members of FP7 countries agreement (Switzerland, Israel, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Turkey, Croatia, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and Serbia, Albania, Montenegro, Bosnia and Herzegovina)

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## The evaluation process

- Transparent evaluation and selection process
- High scientific quality process involving referees
- Feed-back provided to applicants
- Process promoting speed of execution:
- 5th January 2009: 1st Call opening
- 9th February 9th March 2009: Abstract evaluation
- 13<sup>rd</sup> April 8<sup>th</sup> July 2009: Full Application evaluation process
- Grants notification: 8<sup>th</sup> July 2009
- 8 projects starting effectively September to November 2009
   financed for € 1.4m

#### Scientific thematics:


Biological markers, pathological pathways and mechanisms, therapeutic strategies, innovative molecules in the fields of ALS and protection of motor neurons

for an aggregate amount of up to € 1 million of which up to € 300,000 is dedicated to the specific topic of stem cell therapeutic approaches in ALS

### Time Schedule :

- 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2009: 2<sup>nd</sup> call opening
- 11th December 2009: deadline for abstract submission
- 26th January 2010: Notification to selected parties for Full Grant Applications
- 5<sup>th</sup> March 2010: deadline for receipt of Full Grant Applications
- **№8**th June 2010: notification of Grants awarded
- Effective starting date of the granted projects from September 2010

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
